On Sunday, November 17th, we were happy to welcome Assistant to the Bishop Rev. Patti Axel, who installed our Vitality Leadership and Prayer Teams during the worship service, as we begin the Congregation Vitality Process. In this process, we will learn what we need to know about our congregation to ensure that Mt. Zion – St. Luke is and remains a vital congregation. What are the marks of a Vital Congregation? It goes beyond simple attendance and giving records. A *vital* congregation is one in which the people are deeply connected with God, with each other and with the community around it. Vitality is reflected in our worship, in our small groups and in our ministries outside our walls. The process is based on Three Listenings: Listening to God, Listening to each other and listening to our neighbors. The Vitality Leadership Team will guide us through these three listenings and the Prayer Team will pray us through them to be sure we hear where God may be calling us in order that we may participate more fully in his mission to save the world. 
It's Time for Our Annual Christmas Dinner!
