Under the sign of the cross...

I have a simple, wooden cross that I wear around my neck on a piece of black twine. Painted on it is a tiny, smiling Jesus, with arms raised in blessing to those around me. It is not a crucifix, as the Jesus on my cross is alive -victorious over that horrible death he bore. But, before the resurrection, there is the cross.



In my home and in my office, I have a variety of crosses. They hang on my walls, they stand on my desk, they make themselves at home on my windowsills. My jewelry boxes are full of crosses of many shapes, sizes, and colors; one for each season of the Church year. In worship, I make the sign of the cross in blessing at the beginning and the end of the service. It seems that every waking moment of my life involves the cross in some form or other. I *live* under the sign of the cross.

But the crosses that adorn my life are never more meaningful for me than during the Season of Lent - that time of the Church year when we symbolically follow Jesus on his long, slow journey to the cross. It is the time when we remind ourselves that the lovely crosses we surround ourselves with started out as an ugly instrument of torture and death. We remember and we grieve over our part in why Jesus ended up on that cross in the first place. And we are grateful for the forgiveness we are freely given from that very same cross. "Father, forgive them, for they don't know what they are doing."

It is good to set aside a time to remember the tremendous sacrifice Jesus made for us. Good to remember that, because Jesus did not die on that cross, but was raised again to new life, *we too* will never die, but go to live with God for ever. Lent is the time that we remind ourselves of the wondrous love that is woven into every cross we see.

"Pick up your cross, and follow me." Jesus said. And, we do. Even though we don't know where that path may lead, because we know the One in whose footsteps we walk. Dietrich Bonhoeffer puts it best when he said:

"To go one's way under the sign of the cross is not misery and desperation, but peace and refreshment for the soul. It's the highest joy. Then, we do not walk under our self-made laws and burdens, but under the yoke of him who knows us and who walks under the yoke with us. Under his yoke we are certain of his nearness and communion." *The Cost of Discipleship*

This is why we who are Jesus' disciples of today live gladly under the sign of the cross. May the cross you bear be a source of renewed blessing for you as you make your Lenten journey with Jesus this year.
