Well, yesterday morning all the breath went out of me, because when I looked out the window to see how it had faired through the night, I was shocked to see that half of my lovely tomato was gone!

I ran outside in my flip flops, (which I had vowed never to do again after being snake-bit) to gaze forlornly on the half-eaten remains of my dream of a juicy BLT. "Was it a deer? Do they eat tomatoes?" I wondered. But, as I inspected the plant, I quickly pin-pointed the culprit. This is the hope in which we live – the promise of new life embedded in everything, *included us*, and that through Christ, God is reconciling all of creation to himself. One day, everything will be made perfect again, like it was in the beginning, and *no* one - no *thing* - will be able to spoil it for us, ever again! And, so, I'm already looking forward to next year's tomatoes! Thanks be to God!
